

# Mulga Graze Investments Improve Ground Cover with Sustainable Grazing

The National Landcare Programme is currently supporting an investment activity called Mulga Graze. This theme is to support desired outcomes from the sustainable agriculture stream that focuses on the production of food through the investigation of alternative grazing systems to ensure the protection and enhancement of perennial native pasture species.

Throughout the 2016-2017 financial year, South West NRM has issued four contracts to land managers following their Expressions of Interest. In the Bulloo Catchment, Ken, Merlyn and Cameron Hiscock of *Injaberry*, near Toompine, have recently completed their Mulga Graze project, which was one of these four successful submissions.

The Hiscock's have completed 10 kilometres of subdivisional fencing, implemented five alternative watering points, and six kilometres of poly pipe. They have also utilised rotational grazing regimes over 5668 hectares of landscape to improve and enhance perennial pasture composition through tactical grazing protocols. Well done Hiscock's!
