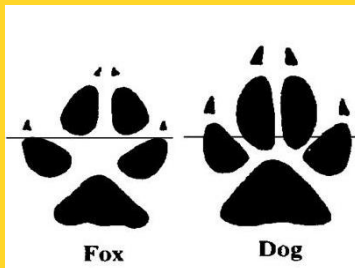


FERAL ANIMAL CONTROL and LANDHOLDER TRAINING DAY

- Kill and injure sheep, cattle and native wildlife
- Spread weeds including Chilean Needle Grass and Blackberries
- Spread numerous diseases including *Parvovirus*, *Hydatids*, *Sarcoptic Mange* and *Neospora caninum*. *Neospora caninum* is a parasite that causes abortion and reduced weight gains in cattle
